In an effort to further emphasize and recognize community service projects which have been completed by 4-H clubs, special awards will be presented to deserving 4-H clubs. Any 4-H club may apply for the awards which will be given to the top club in each of the three categories.

What is it?

A community service project is an activity that benefits others rather than just the 4-H club or club treasury. For example, if a club holds a scrap drive and the money is put in the treasury to pay for 4-H club members' swimming party, this IS NOT a community service project. Helping needy families, mowing grass in the churchyard, painting the township house, and fair improvement, etc. are examples of projects. 2. How was the project organized and how did the 4-H members participate?
3. How were funds raised? (if applicable)
