Price Increase on 4-H Publications

EquiStep

New for 2023!

This is a state mandated training for all horse exhibitors.

All youth enrolled in a horse project (except Project #173 Horseless Horse) must complete a Greene County Horse Education Program. All first-time horse project participants should read 191R Horses, Safety and You. Books are available for purchase through the Extension Office.

- Youth must complete Ohio 4-H's
 EquiSTEP program. The online course
 is housed on ScarletCanvas and is run
 by the State 4-H Office. Information to
 access the 2023 course will be shared
 in future emails.
- Each member must sign up for the course with a unique e-mail address.
- Select 'Modules' to see the 5 steps.
 Watch the video(s) that correspond with each step.
- Complete the quiz associated with the training. You need to score at least a 7 out of 10 to pass the training.
- After scoring at least a 7 out of 10 on the quiz, complete the Certificate of Completion/Course Evaluation Survey. Both you and your county 4-H professional will be emailed a certificate that notes you have completed the EquiSTEP training.

All Greene County Youth must complete the Horse Education Program (EquiStep) requirement by June 1.
