All 4-H members in good standing (enrolled by deadline, completed all requirements such as paperwork, Fair Entry, EquiSTEP) are eligible and encouraged to participate at fair. If there is a safety concern, volunteers will say that the youth is not ready or is unable to participate. We will have shows just as in the past and youth can participate even without the club participating.

Ohio State 4-H Horse Information

4-H Horse Rule Update:

As mentioned, there is a new horse rule book that must be purchased and followed for this year.

- Exhibitors must choose one discipline within each riding style at a horse show. For example, within English, they must choose what seat, either saddle OR hunt and for Western choose between western (pleasure, horsemanship, showmanship) OR ranch (riding, showmanship, pleasure, horsemanship). Youth can't do both. Youth can still show both western and English classes but have to pick within each.
- This includes showmanship classes as well so saddle seat showmanship or hunt seat showmanship for English showmanship and either western seat showmanship classes or ranch seat showmanship classes.
- Exhibitors are expected to purchase 4-H project books yearly.
 We have book checks at skillathons and book checks will be included in at the Ohio State Fair this year.
