Greene County 4-H Important COVID-19 Updates

As of March 18, 2020, 2:45 p.m. (information is subject to change based on updates the 4-H program is receiving daily)

To our 4-H Families:

It has been a quite a couple of weeks with changes coming quickly. Thank you for your patience with your county 4-H staff, the state 4-H office and OSU Extension. I know you have many questions:

- When can we have club meetings?
- Will there be summer camp?
- · Should we invest in projects?
- What about fair?

The answer is at this point, we just don't know. It is all changing rapidly. But what we do know for sure is that we're committed to doing our part to help prevent the spread of the corona virus. We also know that when we choose to act together, we can have incredible positive impacts.

The actions we've taken so far are in alignment with necessary precautions recommended by the World Health Organization, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and Ohio Department of Health. These are in place to help keep us all from getting, or unintentionally spreading, this virus. This includes the temporary closing to the public of our county Extension office. We'll continue to be available via email and phone. Visit our website at greene.osu.edu or call 937-372-9971 to get ahold of our staff.

To help clarify, ALL 4-H events, programs, and activities scheduled between now and April 20 be held virtually, postponed, or cancelled.

We are also suspending 4-H project book distribution, effective as of close of business today through 3/31/2020. This means there will be no project book distribution at the local or state level until after March 31. We will continue to monitor the coronavirus situation and will re-evaluate project book distribution as we get closer to March 31 and share more information with you at that time.

- 3/26- Quality Assurance- <u>CANCELLED</u>- rescheduled for April 29 as of right now- attend either at 5:00 p.m. or 6:30 p.m.
- 3/30- Shooting Sports meeting- <u>CANCELLED</u>- in addition, ALL shoots/practices are <u>CANCELLED through at least April 20th</u>
- 3/31- CARTEENS- CANCELLED
- Deadline for 4-H clubs to inform our office of any roster changes will be extended to April 22. All project changes must be made by this date as well. County dues, ALL remaining paperwork is due this date.
- All Ohio 4-H Night Dayton Dragon tickets should be mailed directly to the Dayton Dragons. Do not drop off any registrations at our office. These need to be postmarked by March 27.
- Flower fundraiser paperwork is now due back to our office by April 21. A final list will be due to the greenhouse the
 next day, so this is a hard-due date, no exceptions will be made. As of right now, pick up date will remain the same.

For our livestock project members and families, Ohio 4-H and the Ohio Department of Agriculture discussed some changes for this year that will help mitigate the effects the corona virus is having on holding in-person programming. For livestock quality assurance (QA) for the 2020 year only:

- QA must still be completed before the opening day of exhibition, however the 45-day prior to the opening of the
 exhibition requirement will not be enforced.
- Youth livestock exhibitors (8-18) may take the online YQCA certification. Please note that Greene County has NOT
 approved this option for 2020 as of right now. BQA and PQA are not allowed to be online either for youth
 exhibitors.

Facebook Live allows real-time interaction with viewers to answer questions and get feedback. Join via a Facebook Group. Participants interact via "Comment" and cannot talk.

Social Media platforms including Facebook, Snapchat and Instagram, support video calling.

Ohio 4-H Club Advisor Resources Tips & Tricks for Meetings When You Can't Meet (in person...)

This is a collection of information and resources you can use to connect with your club for the next few weeks. Please remember - all 4-H events, programs, and activities scheduled between now and April 20 will be held virtually, postponed, or cancelled.

- If you have a large club, hosting an online meeting will be a challenge. To make that more manageable, divide your club into smaller groups (project interest areas, ages, officer team, committees, randomly sorted into groups of 10-15) and then meet virtually.
- Create planning groups fair booth ideas, service projects, fundraisers, future meeting themes.
- Become pen pals with a club in another town (visit another county's website to find a list of clubs: countyname.osu.edu look for "4-H Youth Development").
- Have fun! Host a Facebook Live session and line dance.
- Write letters to seniors in a local care facility or a note of encouragement to health care professionals or first responders.
- Visit Project Central at projectcentral.osu.edu. Rate your 2019 project and explore projects for this year.
- Can you think of a creative fundraiser? Is there a local restaurant where club members could sell online gift cards and get a percentage of the sale?
- Use your tech-savvy teens. Let them coordinate online meetings, upload information for members, record a project demo.
- Visit YouTube for line dances, camp songs, project demos and games.
