Volunteer Corner:

ALL CLUB MEETINGS need to be <u>CANCELLED</u>. This includes all social events, service projects, fundraising events, hands-on events like field trips, shoots, etc., and regular club meetings. This needs to be cancelled until at least July 6.

Club enrollment changes and all dues- We are not going to collect dues for 2020. Meetings- The county meeting requirement for this year is still six meetings. Each county 4-H member will need to work with club leaders to complete six meetings by the end of the year, December 31, 2020. Advisors are welcome to hold meetings virtually if they have the means and have important matters to discuss. Clubs can use Google Hangout or Zoom or any other platform to conduct these meetings.

Quality Assurance

To be eligible for participation in the Greene County Fair, potential youth exhibitors must participate in one of the following Livestock Quality Assurance Programs. If youth are taking the following projects, this is required: Beef (market steers, breeding, feeder calf), Dairy (heifers, feeders and cows if lactating or have lactated and feeders if selling- heifers before lactation do not need it), goats (all), poultry (all), rabbit (all), sheep (all), llamas & alpacas, and swine. Parents are encouraged to attend but not required except for PQA for youth participating at the Ohio State Fair.

We can offer QA trainings by Zoom for 2020 only! This will count for the regular QA requirement from Greene County. If you have any concerns with attending one of these dates, please let us know.

We will have more information about Greene County BQA and PQA requirement available later.

ALL HOG EXHIBITORS: PLEASE READ IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT RACTOPAMINE

The Greene County Agricultural Society (GCAS) voted at the January 2020 board meeting to ban the use of ractopamine in all market hog projects at the 2020 Greene County Fair from birth to time of slaughter. This decision was based on two major issues:

- 1. Packers will be testing for and rejecting any hogs that have been fed ractopamine at any time during their life.
- 2. Union Stockyard will not accept any market hogs that have been fed ractopamine at any time during their life.
- Union Stockyard and the GCAS will be requiring all market hog exhibitors, and their parent/guardian, to sign an affidavit stating that the hog(s) exhibited/sold have never been exposed to ractopamine. Affidavits will be turned in at weigh in with DUNF forms. Greene County Fairboard reserves the right to test hogs, feed, or equipment for traces of ractopamine residues.

More information will be made available as we receive it from the State. This is also a requirement from OSF.









Go to website **extensionpubs.osu.edu**. Search for and select items.

Review your order. (Unfortunately, we cannot accept returns.) Click on "Place Order."


