4-H Enrollment:

Now open. All enrollment is due by April 1 at the latest. Visit https://4honline.com

EquiSTEP

Youth must complete Ohio 4-H's EquiSTEP program.
The online course is housed on ScarletCanvas and is run by the State 4-H Office. Here is the link to enroll in/access EquiSTEP:

To complete EquiSTEP, a participant must enroll using their own unique email address. (Participants should not use their school email addresses as the course enrollment invitation will be blocked by the school's email system.) Participants must view all five videos (introduction and STEPS 1-4) which last approximately one hour in total. Once the videos are completed, participants will be able to access the 10-question quiz. Participants must complete the quiz associated with the training and achieve a minimum score of 7 (out of 10) in order to pass the training. Once the guiz is successfully completed, participants will need to complete the course survey to trigger a certificate of completion. The certificate will be emailed to the participant's email address as well as their county's 4-H email address (countyname4h@osu.edu). The participant must select their correct county to trigger the email to the correct email address and they must click on the submit button at the end of the survey to trigger the email.

All Greene County Youth must complete the Horse Education Program (EquiSTEP) requirement by June 1.

Important Information

All 4-H members in good standing (enrolled by deadline, completed all requirements such as paperwork, Fair Entry, EquiSTEP) are eligible and encouraged to participate at fair. If there is a safety concern, volunteers will say that the youth is not ready or is unable to participate. We will have shows just as in the past and youth can participate even without the club participating.

Ohio State 4-H Horse Information

4-H Horse Rule Update:

As mentioned, there is a new horse rule book that must be purchased and followed for this year.

- 4-H Horse Show Exhibitors must choose one discipline within each riding style at a
 horse show. Exhibitors can still show English and Western. However, within
 English they must choose Saddle Seat or Hunt Seat. Within Western, they must
 choose Western or Ranch. This selection includes showmanship classes. (Please
 note that this does not affect Reining or Western Riding as there is no Ranch option
 for these classes.)
- Ranch Trail has been added to the rulebook and will be offered at the Junior Horse Show. Please note that the obstacles are different between the Trail and Ranch Trail classes, especially the type of gate that is to be used. The common rope gate that is used in Trail is not an acceptable type of gate in Ranch Trail. If a show is not able to offer Ranch Trail, an exhibitor showing in Ranch classes may show in Trail.
- Exhibitors are expected to purchase 4-H project books yearly. We have book checks at skillathons and book checks will be included in at the Ohio State Fair this year.

New/Updated Ohio State Fair Info

- Exhibitors may enter a maximum of four (4) PAS horse classes at the State Fair Junior Horse Show, plus Ground Roping. (Ground Roping does not count towards the maximum of four (4) PAS horse classes).
- Youth wanting to show their horse at the State Fair Junior Horse Show in a showmanship, riding, or driving class must qualify in any two (2) PAS classes in order to compete at the State Fair Junior Horse Show.
- Youth wanting to show in Ground Roping ONLY at the State Fair Junior Horse Show are required to qualify in Ground Roping at a PAS qualifying show but are not required to qualifying in any other PAS horse class. Exhibitors showing in Ground Roping ONLY will not be charged a stall fee.
- All exhibitors wanting to show in Ground Roping at the State Fair Junior Horse Show are required to be enrolled in the Roping project book and must submit their completed project book to the show office the morning of the Ground Roping class for scoring which will count towards their overall class placing.
- Reminder: Counties may allow youth to qualify in more than two classes!
- Ranch Trail will now be offered at the Junior Horse Show. Exhibitors must qualify in Ranch Trail to be eligible to show in Ranch Trail at the Junior Horse Show. Exhibitors showing in any Ranch class at the Junior Horse Show will not be allowed to show in Trail at the Junior Horse Show.
