4-H Urban Immersion Project

**September 21st – September 24th, 2023 -
Washington D.C**

The 4-H Urban Immersion Project (UIP) is an Ohio 4-H initiative that combines cross-cultural learning, teamwork and service learning in the urban environment of Washington, DC.

4-H teens ages 15-18 and still in High School are eligible for this 4-day service-learning experience that will build skills and abilities to prepare youth for success in a diverse workplace as well as build cultural understanding of those who are different. This experience will not be about shopping or sightseeing, although we will visit some monuments and historic sites. The cost of the experience is \$180. Limited scholarship funds are also available. All teen applicants will be contacted to complete an additional phone interview before selection.

Birth Rabbit Dates for 2023 Fair

- Meat Pen and Single Fryer = 5/21/2023
 - Roasters = 01/31/23 - 04/30/23 with a maximum weight of 9 pounds, Must be at least 3 months old.
 - Seniors = 11/30/2022 and earlier
 - 6/8 = 12/01/22 – 01/30/23
 - Juniors = 01/31/23 - 04/30/23
 - Pre-Juniors = 05/06/23 – 06/03/23
 - Fancy D&L = 05/20/23 - 06/03/22
 - Commercial D&L = 05/20/23 - 06/03/23
 - Matching Breeding Pair = 01/30/23 and earlier
- Recommended Breeding Dates for Meat Pens and Single Fryers
- 4/21/2023: This is 100 days prior to the show day.
- Remember that each individual rabbit must weigh between 3.5 and 5.5 pounds. Any under or overweight rabbits will be ineligible for placing in the show.

New for 2023

All swine exhibitors will be required to have a Premise ID. This is mandated by Ohio Department of Agriculture. Premise ID is based on the location of the animal. Please note- you must enter the Premise ID when completing Fair Entry and this number will be checked upon fair arrival. Purchasing 4-H Market Project Animals

Here are some important points to keep in mind:

All market animals:

- Purchase healthy animals from reputable breeders
- Know what vaccinations and parasite control has been completed by breeder
- Ask the breeder what feed the animal has been on to be able to transition the animals to the feed you want to use
- Quarantine animals purchased if you have any other animals at home.
- Observe purchased animals closely for signs of illness (take temperature, monitor eating/drinking, observe changes)
- Establish a valid VCPR for preventative care and treatment
- Properly handle animals and provide proper care to assure you have a healthy animal to bring to fair. All animals must be free of contagious disease such as ring worm, sore mouth, club lamb fungus, warts, lice, etc.

Rabbit:

- Exhibitors may breed or purchase a meat pen. If purchased, the rabbits must be in possession by July 14. Only 1 meat pen, one single fryer, and one single roaster may be entered.
- This New Roaster class will be a home-grown class and is new for the 2023 fair. For the home-grown class the Rabbit committee will be verifying with pictures of the doe and litter with visible tattoo numbers, pedigrees, and possible home visit. These Roasters will also have a tag in date of April 15. You may bring up to 3 rabbits per exhibitor to this tag in. You will only be exhibiting 1 Roaster at fair.



- Youth must submit a Winning 4-H Plan **Request Form by June 14**. A county 4-H professional will review the request and contact you with any questions. They will consider whether making accommodations fundamentally alters the event or provides significant advantage or disadvantage to anyone participating. Judges are expected to follow accommodations.
- The completed form needs to be stapled in the front cover of the project book. The 4-H professional will share appropriate information with those who need it.

Livestock Fair Entry Directions

All Junior Fair livestock exhibitors will complete their livestock entries online. This will replace the paper forms from previous years. This help sheet will guide you through the process. Please read the entire guide before attempting to make your entry to ensure the process is done correctly.

All entries are due to be completed by posted deadline.

When completing online entries, make sure you enroll all your animals that will show at the fair and sign up for showmanship classes. You must follow all Junior Fair rules when entering your animals. **Please give us accurate information regarding tags and the animals you will be bringing to the fair to ensure accuracy for classes/shows and stalling purposes. Do not enroll more animals than what you are planning on bringing to the fair.**



Entry process for FFA members who ARE also 4-H members: Families will login to FairEntry using their 4HOnline account as normal. For the member who is dual-enrolled in 4-H and FFA, they will create their 4-H class entries just like everyone else. The youth will create their FFA animal just as they did their 4-H animals but will designate their FFA chapter as the “club”.

- **FFA members who have siblings in 4-H:** Login into FairEntry with your family 4HOnline information and create a new exhibitor for the FFA member and select your chapter.
- **FFA members who are NOT 4-H members:** FFA members, not enrolled in 4-H, will create a new FairEntry account or use the account created last year if you made one. Follow the steps to enter exhibitor information and adding class entries.


