- Meat Pen and Single Fryer = 5/26/2021
- Seniors = 12/03/20 and earlier
- 6/8 = 12/04/20 02/03/21
- Juniors = 02/04/21 05/03/21
- Pre-Juniors = 05/04/21 and after
- Fancy D&L = 06/08/21 06/22/21
- Commercial D&L = 05/26/21 06/22/21
- Matching Breeding Pair = 02/03/21 and earlier

Recommended Breeding Dates for Meat Pens and Single Fryers

• 4/25/2021: This is 100 days prior to the show day. Remember that each individual rabbit must weigh between 3.5 and 5.5 pounds. Any under or overweight rabbits will be ineligible for placing in the show. Underweight animals are also excluded from the sale.

#### BEEKEEPING PROJECT OPPORTUNITY

The Beekeeping Project (641) can be fascinating, fun, and result in really sweet rewards! Whether you want to keep honeybees to improve pollination, as a hobby, or for harvesting and selling honey and bee products, the 4-H Beekeeping project will help you care for and manage honeybees. Greene County 4-H members who are interested or just want to learn more about the project have a unique resource to help. The Greene County Beekeepers Association (GCBA) not only sponsors the Fair trophy and awards, but also has experienced beekeeper volunteers willing to mentor 4-H members. (Did we mention that GCBA members helped develop the Ohio project?) The GCBA also offers sponsorship opportunities (typically providing basic beehive equipment) to help offset startup costs.

<u>Attn Club Leaders:</u> Looking for a guest speaker to discuss project options? The GCBA has volunteers to provide an overview (Zoom or in-person when permitted)

There are three levels in the Ohio 4-H Beekeeping project:

Beginner—Members with no experience (1st year project, new to beekeeping). Youth learn basics of beekeeping. At this level, youth are not required to have bees (but many prefer to 'jump right in'). The primary goal is to learn basic beekeeping first-hand, and one of the best ways to do this is with the guidance of a local beekeeper. Intermediate—Members with some experience (1st year project with previous experience, or 2nd year project). Youth typically acquire their own colony of bees and learn how to care for and manage the hive throughout the year. A realistic goal at this level is to manage basic beekeeping operations that result in a healthy colony and the production of some 'surplus' honey for the novice beekeeper.

Advanced—Members with experience. Youth at this level are typically more independent and set more advanced learning goals such as comb or varietal honey production, pollen harvesting, queen rearing, and bee diseases and parasites.
