EquiStep New for 2023!

This is a state mandated training for all horse exhibitors. All youth enrolled in a horse project (except Project #173 Horseless Horse) must complete a Greene County Horse Education Program. All first-time horse project participants should read 191R Horses, Safety and You. Books are available for purchase through the Extension Office.

- Youth must complete Ohio 4-H's EquiSTEP program.
 The online course is housed on ScarletCanvas and is run by the State 4-H Office. Here is the link to enroll in/access EquiSTEP: qo.osu.edu/equistep2023
- To complete EquiSTEP, a participant must enroll using their own unique email address. (Participants should not use their school email addresses as the course enrollment invitation will be blocked by the school's email system.) Participants must view all five videos (introduction and STEPS 1-4) which last approximately one hour in total. Once the videos are completed, participants will be able to access the 10question quiz. Participants must complete the quiz associated with the training and achieve a minimum score of 7 (out of 10) in order to pass the training. Once the quiz is successfully completed, participants will need to complete the course survey to trigger a certificate of completion. The certificate will be emailed to the participant's email address as well as their county's 4-Hemail address (countyname4h@osu.edu). The participant must select their correct county to trigger the email to the correct email address and they must click on the submit button at the end of the survey to trigger the email.

All Greene County Youth must complete the Horse Education Program (EquiStep) requirement by June 1.

Fair Entry –

We will be opening fair entry in Mid-May. Deadline to get your animals entered is Tuesday, July 6th.

All 4-H and FFA Exhibitors need to register animals and reserve your animal and tack pens for the 2023 Greene County Fair. This includes dogs and horses.

Each club will be allowed 5 times to use the show arena before fair. Call the Extension office to schedule your dates. Two-week lead time will be strictly enforced. This is so the Extension office can notify Sr. Fairboard of the dates.

PAS Horse Shows

- Visit http://horse.osu.edu for all information regarding PAS shows including dates, rules, and more.
- The Out-of-County PAS Approval Form is available online at horse.osu.edu. Kids who participate in out-of-county PAS shows must upload a completed Out-of-County PAS Approval Form after each show to their 4HOnline account. A step-by-step guide to entering/uploading required horse information to 4HOnline is available online at horse.osu.edu.

Ohio State Fair Junior Horse Show

Online registration for the Ohio State Fair Junior Horse Show for 4-H and FFA exhibitors that have qualified at a PAS qualifying show will open June 1, 2023. Entries will close on July 1, 2023. Coggins tests are required again this year so exhibitors showing at the Junior Horse Show must have their horse's negative Coggins test (dated on or after January 1, 2023) uploaded to their 4-H online account by the entry deadline of July 1, 2023.



Accommodations: Youth with Special Needs

- 4-H welcomes and encourages youth with special needs to participate and will make reasonable accommodations. The Winning 4-H Plan enables youth to tailor the 4-H experience to their needs and helps maintain a positive relationship between the youth's family, 4-H volunteers, and county 4-H professionals
- Youth must submit a Winning 4-H Plan Request Form by June 14. A county 4-H professional will review the request and contact you with any questions. They will consider whether making accommodations fundamentally alters the event or provides significant advantage or disadvantage to anyone participating. Judges are expected to follow accommodations.
- The completed form needs to be stapled in the front cover of the project book. The 4-H professional will share appropriate information with those who need it.
