Addressing nutrition is part of our Community Health

Improvement Plan (CHIP) Priority 1: Chronic Disease, with root causes including lack of knowledge, lack of physical activity, and poor food choices.

**Our Goal:** People of Greene County are preventing and managing chronic disease.

As of 2013, the percentage of obese adults in Greene County at 31% is the same as the state but is higher than the national Healthy People 2020 target of 30.5%.

A critical barrier to healthy lifestyles across Greene County is food

insecurity. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) defines food insecurity as a lack of consistent access to enough food for an active, healthy life. According to an article from the Journal of Nutrition, most adults living in food insecure households report being unable to afford balanced meals. Studies show that food insecurities can also lead to adverse health effects for both adults and children, including chronic illness, along with developmental and mental health problems.

## Who is eligible for WIC program services?

- Pregnant women
- Breastfeeding women
- Women who have had a baby within the past 6 months
- Infants
- Children up to age 5

### To qualify, a participant must:

- Meet the moderate income requirement (WIC serves many two-income working families)
- Have a nutrition need (determined by nutrition professionals at the WIC clinic)
