PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

How time flies. It's already time for the March/April Newsletter. January through March is that time of year when I pull out my favorite gardening books and read through their recommendations of things I should be doing or getting ready to do. These books make great reminders of the things I need to be doing so I don't fall too far behind in my pre-season activities.

My favorite reference book remains Crockett's Victory Garden by James Underwood Crockett. In addition to the Victory Garden he wrote Crockett's Flower Garden, Crockett's Indoor Garden, and the 12-volumn Time-Life Encyclopedia of Gardening series - about twenty books in all. Most were written between 1975 and 1980 and his most well know and popular books like Victory Garden and Flower Garden are written in the month-tomonth format beginning in February or March. Still today his books receive 4–5-star ratings but are not easy to find. I bought my copy of The Victory Garden in paperback when it first came out in 1977 for \$9.95. I just looked it up on Amazon and the paperback version is offered today for \$111.00. The hard cover version is \$179.00.

So, you ask, who is Jim Crockett? For those who don't remember Jim, in April 1975 WGBH in Boston launched a weekly garden show The Victory Garden hosted by Jim Crockett and produced and directed by Russell Morash. The show and Jim became instant favorites of viewers across the United States. For the garden they took a 75' X 75' square of sodded ground adjacent to the WGBH studio and turned it, along with a donated greenhouse into The Victory Garden. His Victory Garden book was written a couple years later (1977) in response to the encouragement from viewers for an accompanying book to the weekly TV show. While the show was a great success, Jim suffered from a lengthy illness and died in July 1979. This was a big shock to his viewers since no one at the time was even aware he was ill. Numerous hosts and iterations followed, but never with the success and following of the original.

When Russell Morash was asked why the show was such a success he said "But mostly, of course, the program succeeds because of Jim himself. He's a born teacher, a man who is willing to share his knowledge because he knows that gardening can give people pleasure and can actually improve their lives." I think the thing I remember that impressed me most
