Greene County Master Gardener Business Meeting Minutes May 14, 2019 Buckeye Room Extension Office, Xenia Ohio

Vice President, Dan Denham called the meeting to order at 1835

Continuing Education Presentation:

Kim Hupman presented: "Differences between Blue Spruce and Norway Spruce"

The blue spruce has bluish to silver gray needles and can grow 30 to 60 feet in height with a 15 to 30 foot spread. The branches are dense, and the tree has a broad pyramidal shape. The Norway spruce is slightly larger, growing to 40 to 60 feet tall with a spread of 25 to 30 feet. The tree is also shaped in a pyramidal form but the branches hang downward.

Both trees have been over used in the land scape, are susceptible to diseases such as needle drop, White Pine weevil, and canker. Since treatments can be costly, it may be best to choose an alternate tree. Some trees to consider: Concolor fir, Korean fir, Alaska cypress, Serbian spruce, and dawn redwood.

New Business:

- a. Continuing Education update: "Plants for your Landscape" on October 11 in Springfield.
- b. Phenology Report: Frost Free date is May 12; Emerald Ash Borer will emerge; Boxwood Leaf miner emerges on May 9. Current soil temperature is 50*F; 65*F in raised beds.
- c. "What's been eating my Coneflowers?" by Jane Worth: Coneflowers are the host plant for the Silvery Checkerspot Butterfly caterpillar. Females lay their eggs in batches of 100 on the underside of leaves. The caterpillars eat holes in the leaves, eat the edges of the leaves, and leave much frass. The partially grown caterpillars can overwinter at the bass of the plant.
- d. Ninebark Shrub Trials: Contact Jim Chatfield (through the Extension Office) if you are able to help with growing space and observations of powdery mildew.
- e. The Board of Trustees has requested Jerry Haun do an audit of the By-Laws.
- f. Officer Candidates are needed for: President, Secretary, and two Board Members at Large. We will vote in October.

Coordinator Report:
